Schools continue to find exciting new ways to incorporate TGS Teen PSAs into a variety of content areas and existing programs to engage students and enhance learning. Here are some of our favorites:

## **1** SCHOOLWIDE CAMPAIGNS

Schools use TGS Teen PSAs to raise awareness during Red Ribbon Week, Bullying Prevention Month, Child Abuse Prevention Month, Suicide Prevention Month and more!

## **2** PEER HELPER/MENTOR PROGRAMS

These groups survey the student body with TGS Teen PSA Student Safety Survey and then use PSAs based on results as content for their peer helper and peer mentor programs.

## **3** HEALTH CLASSES

TGS Teen PSAs are used to open and enhance health class discussions on health-related topics such as substance abuse, vaping, suicide, depression, mental health, abuse and more.

## **4** CREATIVE WRITING PROMPTS

TGS Teen PSAs are used in Language Arts classes as prompts for creative writing, storytelling, essays, speech topics, debates and more.

## **5** ADVISORY/CHARACTER BUILDING

TGS Teen PSAs are used in morning announcements, for advisory discussions, and to supplement character building programs already in place.

## **6** JOURNALISM, THEATRE, MULTIMEDIA

TGS Teen PSAs are a great addition to elective classes that encourage creative expression and develop artistic skills. TGS Teen PSAs encourage students to think outside the box.

## **7** COUNSELOR/SRO DISCUSSIONS

Counselors and School Resource Officers use TGS Teen PSAs to open discussion on personal health and safety, respect and tolerance, and crime prevention. They can also help reduce the occurrence of first time offenders.

## **8** COMMUNITY SERVICE ACTIVITY

High school students select age appropriate TGS Teen PSAs to share with younger students at feeder schools. PSAs are shown, students vote for their favorite and discuss how actions impact consequences.
